Frequently Asked Questions

- Is the DNP program completely online?
 The DNP program is completely online except for one clinical orientation for students in the BSNDNP and MN-DNP who are adding a new specialty certification.
- 2. How often do I have to come to campus?

 Students in the BSNDNP and MN-DNP adding a new specialty certificationare required to attend a 34 day Clinical Orientation the fall semester in which they begin clinical courses for their specialty.
- 3. Do the DNP programs have an orientation? All DNP students are required to complete a two-part orientation once accepted into the program. The first part is a Virtual Orientation Site requiring the completion of several modules prior to the DNP Orientation Webinar, which is the second part of the orientation. The DNP Orientation Webinar is a oneday live event conducted online. Students are not required to come to campus.
